## Religious Education

#### First Communion Class (Ages 7-8)

Classroom: St. Augustine - St. Joseph House

This class aims at preparing children for the reception of the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion. The preparation begins in a year-long class in which children receive general instruction in their Catholic faith and a life lived in relationship with Christ. Learning how to pray, examining the difference between right and wrong, studying the Ten Commandments, and beginning to understand the importance of each sacrament are guideposts in starting each child's person life in Christ.

After missing her Catholic school culture, she moved to Wisconsin in pursuit of degrees in Political Science and Philosophy from Marquette. Allie has been an active Parishioner at Cantius since 2021. This is her first year of teaching First Communion and she is excited to introduce her students to the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

#### Old Testament Class (Ages 8-9)

One of the foundational areas of focus for an authentically lived Catholic life is knowledge of our own tradition and heritage. Spending a year studying, reading, and praying with the books and stories of the Old Testament afford each child time to become personally familiar with thes important stories and histories of our faith. Familiarity with the Old Testament naturally leads one to have a deeper understanding and appreciation for the New Testament.



Instructor: Br. Gabriel Ortiz-Jimenez, SJC was born in Mayagüez, Puerto Rico. He grew up on the east coast of the U.S. in a Catholic family. After graduating high school, he attended college seminary. Discerning that this was not the right path, he worked as a religious educator and sacristan. Br. Gabriel began discerning with the Canons Regular of St. John Cantius as a postulant in June of 2022 and made his first profession of religious vows in August of 2024.

#### New Testament Class (Ages 9 - 10)

Classroom - St. Elias - St. Joseph House

Transitioning from a deeper familiarity of the Old Testament previously, children now begin to pour over the important passages of the New Testament. The four Gospel accounts should be texts that each student has a basic knowledge of and a personal relationship with. Beyond just a general knowledge of these writings, the hope of this class is that children will see and understand the Good News of Christ's coming among men.



Instructor: Br. Edward Anderson grew up in Evanston, IL. The third of five children. When his family began attending St. John Cantius Parish in 2009 he became very involved in the Youth Activities: Choir, Altar Serving, Summer Camps. All of these formative events and being surrounded by a group of strong Catholic friends led to his vocation with the Canons Regular of St. John Cantius. Br. Edward entered Postulancy in June of 2022. He is now a first-year professed Religious Brother.

#### Confirmation A (Ages 10-11)

This first year of Confirmation preparation will begin the child's first steps towards an individual ownership of their faith. Building upon their knowledge of the Old and New Testaments, children in this class will start to examine the broader tradition of the Church as well as how to live a life of Catholic discipleship. Full participation in the life of the Church is the goal of this class: participation in which students are able to articulate their faith both corporately and personally.



Instructor: Br. Joshua Smerker, SJC was born and raised in Helena, Montana, where he spent much of his childhood outdoors, with a deep love for fishing and skiing. In the summer of 2021, he joined the Canons Regular of St. John Cantius and has been stationed at the parish since. This will be his second year assisting and teaching Confirmation A.

#### Confirmation B (Ages 11-12)

The program is structured as a pilgrimage towards the great day of Confirmation. It is to be completed only *after* Confirmation A and will contain three inseparable elements: Prayer, study, and witness. These will be expressed through class prayer, a retreat, discussion about friendship with Christ, a comprehensive review of the Catechism, supernatural destiny and purpose of life, and service to the poor, the elderly and the Gospel of Life.



Instructor: Mr. Bill Melichar grew up in the Chicago west suburbs and has been a parishioner at St. John Cantius since 1998. A graduate of Loyola University Law School, he volunteers as an attorney representing the best interests of children in guardianship cases. In 2018 he completed a master's degree in Dogmatic Theology summa cum laude.

#### Fundamentals of the Faith (Ages 12 - 17)

This course takes an in-depth look at the first half of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, Benedict XVI, in his Apostolic Letter *Porta Fidei* for the beginning of the Year of Faith in 2012, expressed the desire that many people will "feel a strong need to know better and to transmit to future generations the faith of all times." The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is not a mere collection of doctrines. It provides the groundwork for understanding what we Catholics believe. The purpose of this course is to engage with the material and come to a better understanding (and love) of our Catholic Faith.



Instructor: Mr. Ed Huelke managed restaurants from Chicago to Washington DC to London, Kuala Lumpur and Sydney Australia. Studied music education and was a counselor at MacNeal Hospital in Berwyn. He's an Eagle Scout and St John Cantius parishioner since 2005. He's married with six children.

## Additional Information

#### **Primary Educators**

St. John Cantius recognizes and respects the primary role of parents in the education of their own children. The means used for this education fall within the prerogative of the parents. However, the administration of the sacraments is the responsibility of the pastor.

• Archdiocesan policy states: "The pastor or his designate shall determine the readiness of children in light of their disposition and preparation prior to the first reception of the sacraments." (Canons 777 & 914)

Therefore, it is not permissible to present your child for any of these sacraments unless and until the child has been determined ready by the pastor.

#### All classes begin promptly at 10:00 a.m.

and finish at 10:50 a.m.. Special arrangements can be made for those who might need to leave early (either to sing in a choir, or server for Mass.)

- All students in the First Communion Class will not be released from the classroom until a parent or sibling presents themselves to pick up the student. The other classes will be released on their own.
- If anyone other than a parent or sibling will pick up your child, please send an email authorizing what day this will occur.

#### Attendance

Email notification to the class instructor is necessary for an excused absence. More than *three unexcused absences* will result in the student to possibly be dismissed from the program.

• N.B. Programs, sports, recitals, vacations are not acceptable reasons for absence and are considered *unexcused*.

### Additional Information

#### Class Cancelations

Classes may be canceled due to inclement weather. You will be notified by email either the night before or early morning should a class be canceled.

#### Behavioral Issues

If behavior problems occur the instructor will correct the student as needed. If problems persist the parents will then be notified and if necessary, the student may be dismissed from the program.
